1 Municipality

1.1 Introduction to the Town of LeRoy

The Town of LeRoy is a thriving community in east central Saskatchewan. The town is an hour and a half east of Saskatoon, and two hours north of Regina. LeRoy has experienced many changes over the years and has pulled together to remain a viable rural community. Recently, approximately 100 new jobs have been directly created within the community through various projects and new businesses locating to the area.

LeRoy has in the past and will in the future continue to have a strong community spirit and a willingness to be proactive in its own livelihood. In LeRoy, people can experience a small town atmosphere with big town ideas. LeRoy is strategically located in the heart of Saskatchewan's value added agriculture industry and equipment manufacturing region. Living in the Town of LeRoy has many benefits over a larger centre as tax incentives, moderately priced housing and businesses promotions make the community a more affordable place to work and raise a family.

1.2 History

The Town of LeRoy, the Rural Municipalities' center, is surrounded by a prosperous sure-crop agricultural district. The early settlers were mostly a mix of English, Scottish, Irish and Scandinavian. The first settlers to the area were the Gregory brothers in 1903.

In 1907, the first school, known as Bog End, was built ½ mile east of the present town site. As the school and the area were known as Bog End, the Post Office assumed that name as well. In 1921, the Post Office was moved to the town site and was operated by Harry Hazeldine from his grocery store.

In 1919 planning for a new town site began on SW 13-35-20 W2 (railroad land). The Railroad named the proposed building site Unwin. When it was made known that a building site was planned, much interest was aroused regarding business enterprises and services. Starting from nothing, a lot of construction erupted and buildings appeared in rapid order for the next few years. The placement of buildings was dictated and orientated in relation to the proposed railway track.

The original name of Bog End was not considered by area residents to be a suitable name, and therefore, Bog End was changed to LeRoy on January 21, 1920, named in honor of an early settler's son. The young man was killed in France during World War I.

Railroad construction began in 1920, and railroad service commenced in 1921. This activity spurred the development of the town site businesses and services which emerged to support the development. The Village progressed rapidly in this era, with additions of restaurants, grocery stores, a hotel, lumber yards, banks, garages, elevators, blacksmiths and many other commercial ventures.

On December 5, 1922 LeRoy was incorporated as a Village and on March 1st, 1963, became a Town.

The Town of LeRoy has grown over the many years since conception and has succeeded in remaining a prosperous rural community. LeRoy is well known for its strong community spirit and ability to accomplish many projects with success.

1.3 Geophysical attributes (area size, soil types/terrain, climate)

Soil in the surrounding area is a mixture of dark gray and gray luvisolic and varies from dark brown to black, allowing a wide range of agricultural products. The physical features blend from

level farmland to rolling hills to some moderately deep valleys throughout the area. There are small lakes peppered throughout the region that provide many fishing, bird watching and other recreational opportunities.

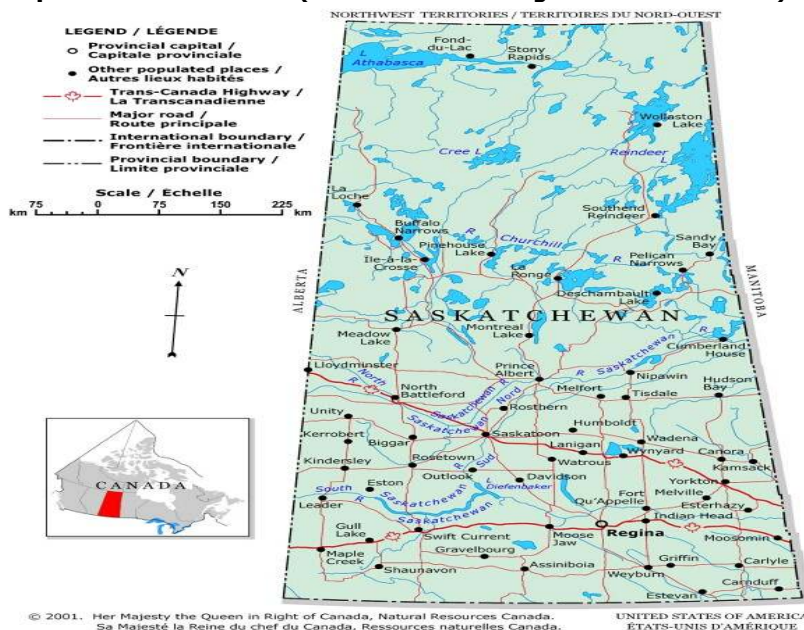

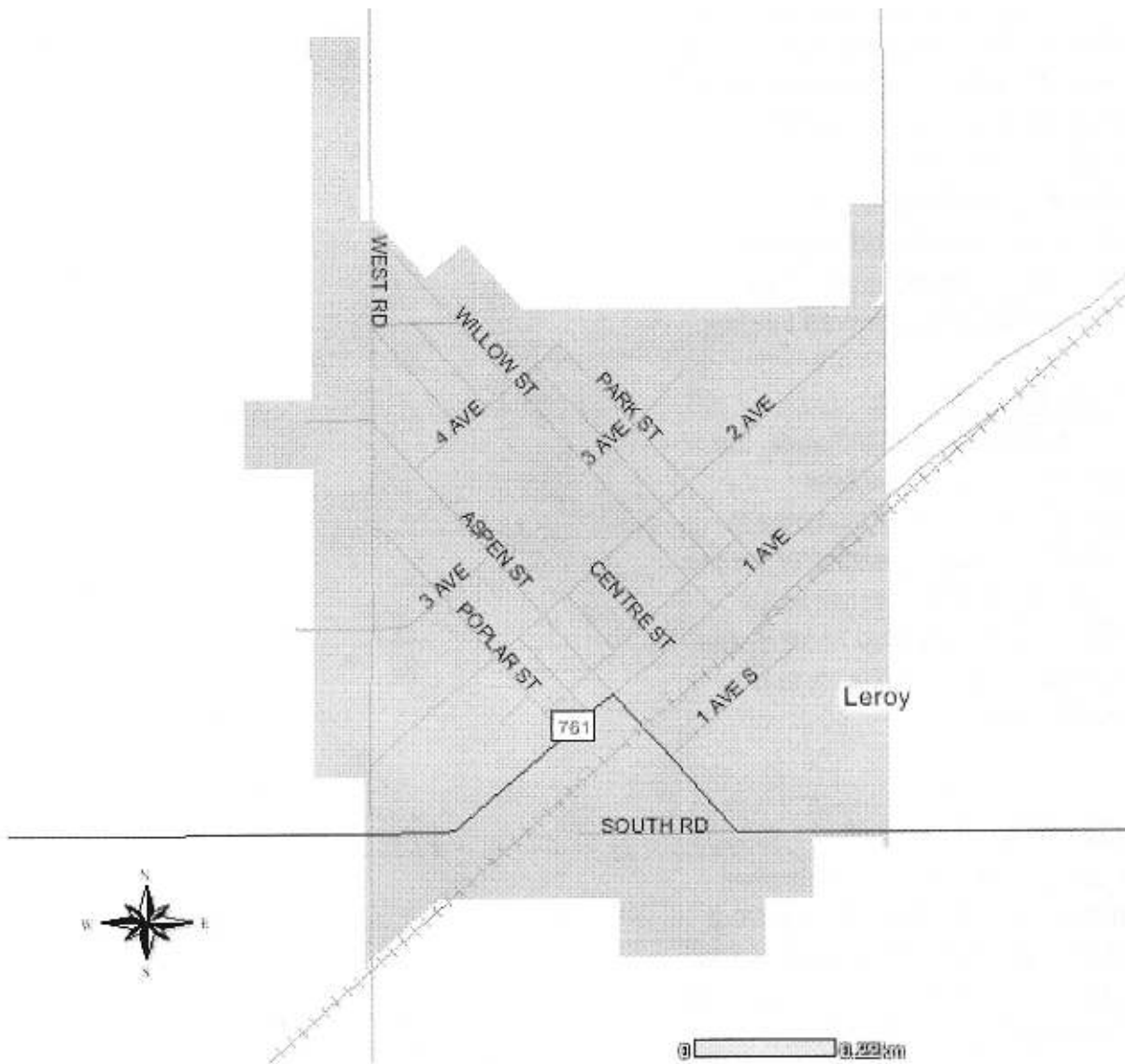

5.2 Industry Profile

5.2.1 Agriculture

5.2.1.1 Regional Agriculture Overview

Saskatchewan has often been referred to as "***The Breadbasket of the World***". Grains, oilseeds, dairy, livestock and poultry, fruit and vegetables are some of the examples of products grown in Saskatchewan and sold throughout the world. Approximately 45% of the entire area of Saskatchewan is farmland. Wheat and barley are two of the most important grains grown. Other significant crops grown are oats, rye, flax, canola, mustard and lentils, with numerous others grown on a smaller volume basis. The Carlton Trail region has been called "*The Sure Crop District*" since this region has rarely seen a crop failure in the past 100 years. In the Carlton Trail region there are three major pork producers based out of the region - Big Sky Farms, one of the largest producers in Western Canada; Stomp Pork Farms, and Sinnet Pork Farms. There are also dairy cattle, poultry and other exotic animals raised in the area. A fully integrated beef feed lot/ethanol plant is also located near Lanigan - Pound-Maker Agventures.

The significance of agriculture to Saskatchewan goes well beyond the products that we grow. It also involves all of the related agri-businesses that process these products, such as bagging, bio fuels (bio diesel and ethanol), crop cleaning and food processing. Inter-related businesses, such as agricultural machinery manufacturing, maintenance and repair, trucking and other transportation, fertilizer/fuel/pesticide/herbicide distribution, etc., contribute to the agriculture sector. These contributions, from all agriculture associated businesses are the leading contributor to the GDP in Saskatchewan.

5.2.2 Manufacturing

5.2.2.1 Regional Manufacturing Overview

Saskatchewan's Manufacturing Industry has a very diverse base. The largest manufacturing industries in Saskatchewan include chemical, machinery, food, fabricated metal production and wood, with over 30,300 people employed in this industry provincially. In the Carlton Trail region there are several businesses that specialize in manufacturing agricultural or related equipment, (Bourgault Industries, Del-Air Systems Ltd., Doepker Industries, FP Bourgault Tillage Tools, Prairie Agriculture Machinery Institute (PAMI), Schulte Industries). Examples where this equipment would be used are, for tillage and rock removal, spraying and fertilizing, livestock, forage and grain handling, storage and transportation. This top of the line equipment can be found throughout the world including: the United States, Mexico, Western Europe, Australia, South America, among others.

5.2.3 Mining

5.2.3.1 Regional Mining Overview

Mining is the third largest industry in Saskatchewan after oil, gas and agriculture. The province is part of the Canadian Shield, where many metals and minerals are found. Saskatchewan produces a third of the world's supply of potash. Saskatchewan is one of Canada's top three mineral producing provinces. This industry creates approximately 20,000 direct and indirect jobs. The potash reserves in Saskatchewan are enormous. Saskatchewan is the largest potash producer and exporter in the world, supplying over one third of the world demand. By moderate estimates, Saskatchewan could supply the current levels of world demand for potash for several hundred years. In the Carlton Trail region there are two Potash mines, one located in Lanigan and the other in Colonsay. There is also a Sulphate of Potash/Potassium Sulphate mine closer to Wynyard.

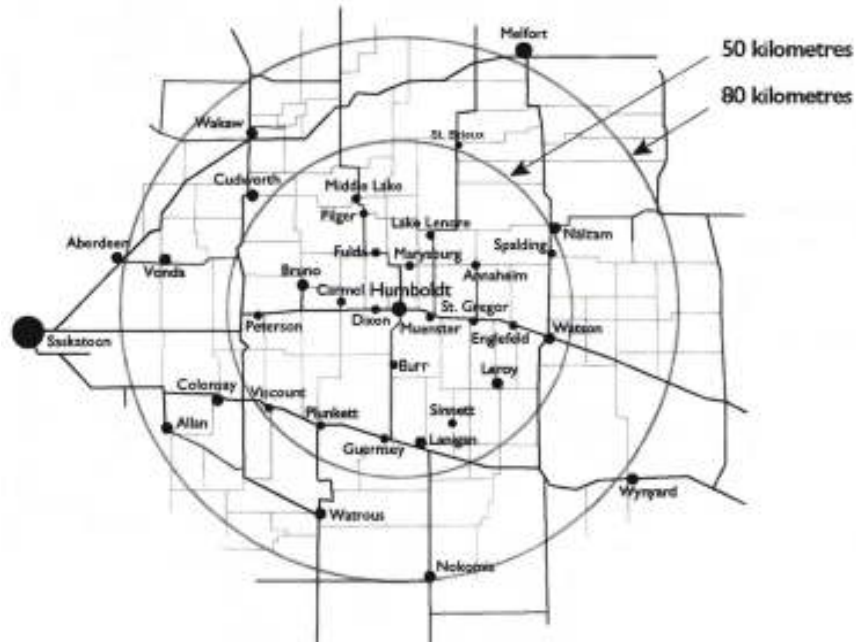
5.3 Regional Trading Area (sales of grain, livestock, purchase of machinery, consumer spending)

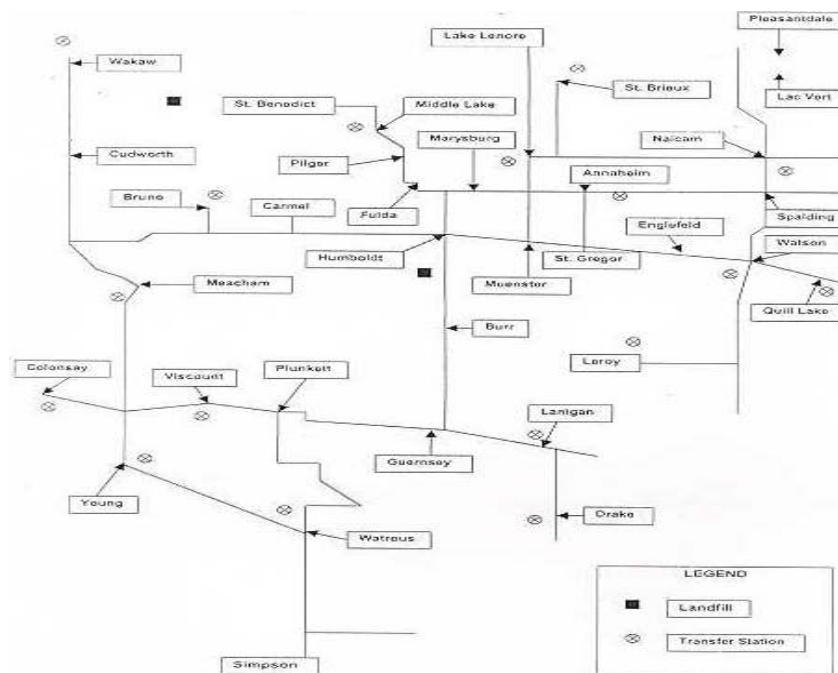

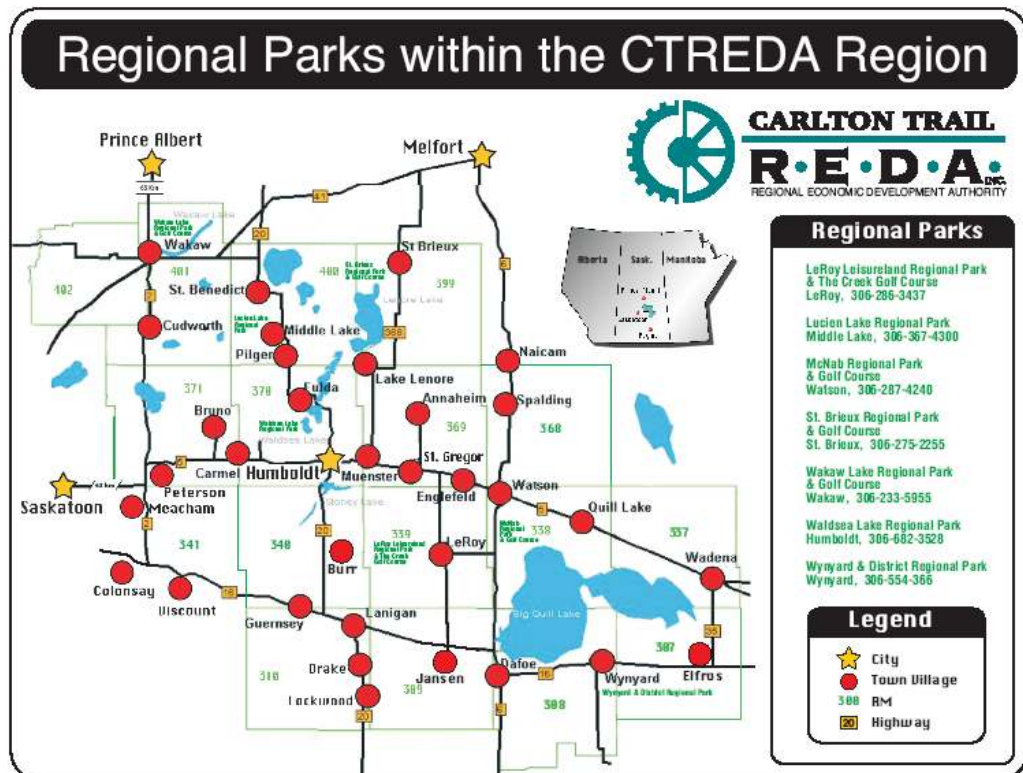
